

# FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



Ordinarily, March 19th marks the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. As March 19th falls on a Sunday this year, St. Joseph's feast is transferred to Monday this week. While not much is known about St. Joseph from an historical point-of-view, he nonetheless remains an important person to the world and especially to the Catholic Church. Pope Bl. Pius IX named St. Joseph as "Patron of the Universal Church" sixteen years (right down to the day) after he infallibly declared the dogma of the Blessed Mother's Immaculate Conception.

In the decree *Quemadmodum D*eus, the Church draws a connection between Joseph, the Son of Jacob, and St. Joseph himself. Drawing a parallel between the two men, this document notes they both were appointed by God guardians of treasures that would nurture the people and bring them to the treasures of God. As the appointed spouse for Mary, St. Joseph would take on the task of protecting her and guiding her through not only the birth, but the tumultuous years following Christ's Nativity as the Holy Family fled into Egypt to escape Herod's wrath. Accordingly, Pius IX observes, the Church also can turn to St. Joseph for protection in difficulty and to experience the outpouring of God's treasures.

I often hear from people concerns about the current state of things, whether it be a matter of geopolitics or the life of the Church or something much more personal and intimate. Whatever the tumult of this life, St. Joseph is a mighty guardian for all of us. As we rejoice in the Solemnity of St. Joseph tomorrow, let us invoke him as the Patron of the Universal Church who will help every member of the Church to experience God's abundant goodness and share in the salvation that comes from Christ.

I don't know Fr. Stu personally, but I've heard a fair number of his homilies. I think it is safe to assume that if he and I were to get into a discussion, each of us would cringe at the opinions of the other. But Fr. Stu happens to offer the only confession time that works with my schedule. That means that, quite by accident, Fr. Stu is my regular confessor. For years now, he's sat patiently on the other side of the grille, listening to me pour out the details of my transgressions, from the pathetic to the embarrassing, and he absolves me of my sins.

In the Gospel, Christ links vision with humility and pride with blindness. We see again and again in Scripture how God delights in surprising us, in revealing himself through people, places, and experiences we not only didn't expect but perhaps had totally written off. We are right to be proud of the truth, but we are wrong if the truth causes us to be proud of ourselves. The truth no more belongs to the one who believes it than sight belongs to the blind man in the Gospel. A gift does not reflect on the recipient. It reflects on the giver.

I've decided to be grateful that God gave me a confessor whom I strongly disagree with. In that confessional, Fr. Stu is a priest, and I am a sinner.


