

### FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



I have always been a person who enjoys rituals, whether it is in how to clean my room or how to get ready to study or how to worship God. The creation of habits and the symbolic value of them have always fascinated me, which no doubt helps explain why liturgical worship is something I find quite edifying for my soul. The movements within the Mass, for example, are layered with meaning that helps direct my thinking towards a contemplation of the mystery of God. Ritual, whether a personal one of my own making or a shared one that I have received from others, just makes sense to me and so I embrace it as strongly as possible.

The Season of Lent is a time when we embrace a wide variety of rituals that help shape the next six weeks to draw us closer to God. Abstaining from meat on Fridays or attending the Stations of the Cross are two of the more noticeable rituals people adopt during this time, but most assuredly we all have some additional ones we do personally. For example, I have started recently creating a little ritual where I will buy something for *Mardi Gras* that I will enjoy, but also has a spiritual benefit that I can use during Lent. This year I chose to purchase the complete set of St. Augustine's *City of God* from the Loeb Classical Library, which has both the original Latin and a literal English translation right alongside one another. As we make our way through Lent, I'll have this theological classic right alongside me to provide spiritual and intellectual insight. It's a simple little gesture, but making it into a yearly ritual of buying something on Fat Tuesday that will enrichen Lent is a way of helping me to truly embrace the rhythm of the liturgical year.

With Lent underway, I encourage each of us to look to those various rituals that will help us to embrace more completely the significance and meaning of Lent. As we draw into the life of Christ through both the Church's rituals and our own, may this holy season help us to become greater witnesses to the Lord.

#### RECOGNIZE GOD IN ORDINARY MOMENTS

Lent & The Flood — I would bet money that somewhere in your church this Lent, there's a bare tree branch draped in purple fabric and an empty bowl filled with rocks. The desert imagery that surrounds the season of Lent isn't a cliché — or if it is, it's only because clichés are essentially true. Lent is the dessert. Lent is the wilderness. Lent is the time of less. But what if Lent was also the flood?

It seems counterintuitive, floods are excessive, and we don't think of Lent as a time for superabundance. Lent is when we limit experiences outside of ourselves in order to limit proclivities within ourselves. Lent is not a time for anything to be washing over us, consuming us, carrying us away on a tide. Unless...it is. Consider the flood of the Old Testament. An act of destruction, yes, but also an act of purification. An endurance test for the soul, an epic trust fall exercise between God and Noah in which Noah had to ride the literal waves, clinging to life as God wiped away everything familiar. Everything sinful.

In Lent, we relinquish our weaknesses and our infirmities to the flood. It's frightening, certainly. But it's also exciting. Because just as the flood destroys everything, it also makes everything possible. It is a baptism. Lent, like the flood, makes the world new.
