

FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



"Real men wear pink" is a mantra that has been used for a while now as part of the breast cancer awareness and support campaign. I can recall before this became a part of the larger effort to address breast cancer that there was a more ironic and defiant tone to that message, which was coined in response to the fact that so few men ever actually wear pink clothing. Indeed, the color pink is a decidedly non-masculine one, so it is no wonder that it is rare to find men wearing it and those who do making it a point to defend their choice. Nevertheless, twice a year, the Church has the option for priests to wear "rose" (i.e. pink) vestments and we come to one such weekend now.

I often laugh at the priests who choose to wear the pink vestments for *Gaudete* Sunday and then protest that they are not in fact pink, but rather "rose." As anybody familiar with the rose flower knows, a rose is not a color, but rather a beautiful flower that comes in many colors. One such color is pink, which the Church uses today to celebrate that we are at the midpoint of Advent. We have been focusing on the end times in our readings and prayers, but soon the shift will be focusing on the Nativity and all that took place to get ready for the Savior's birth. The reason for this shift is simple: if we want to know how to prepare for Christ's Second Coming, we should look at His First Coming.

The memory of God's work in bringing the Incarnation into existence is truly worthy of rejoicing. Therefore, I gladly and without shame admit that I am wearing pink vestments at Mass this weekend. Rejoicing in God's saving work should cause all of us to be willing to risk some level of embarrassment, such as a grown man dressing in pink, and not worry about defending ourselves. Today, let us all rejoice in the truly marvelous work of God.


PILGRIMAGE TO THE HOLY LAND


