

FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



This Sunday, October 22nd, is the Memorial of St. John Paul II in honor of the day in which His Holiness was officially installed as Bishop of Rome. While the Sunday trumps St. John Paul II's feast liturgically, it nonetheless is fitting for Catholics around the world to honor such an historical figure and seek the intercession of a mighty saint. As the events surrounding John Paul II's papal election happened 45 years ago now, it is easy to forget just how significant of an event it was to have a Polish cardinal elected after more than 400 years of Italians being elected pope. Yet, by God's Divine Providence, Cardinal Wojtyla accepted election with the following words:

With obedience in faith to Christ, my Lord, and with trust in the Mother of Christ and the Church, in spite of great difficulties, I accept.

While biographers and analysts have ample material to choose for their study of John Paul II's pontificate, it strikes me that the theme of obedience is a key one to consider when evaluating his exercise of the Petrine ministry. So often, as Catholics, we can have an aggrandized view of the Holy Father and elevate him nearly to the level of a demigod, but John Paul II's magnificent words on the occasion of his election are a great corrective to such imaginings. The Bishop of Rome, while incredibly powerful and uniquely important for the Catholic Church and the whole world, is still but a servant. In particular, the pope must always be a servant to the truth and this is achieved by his obedience to the Catholic faith.

Very often our media—both Catholic and secular—present the pope as an innovator and focus their coverage on the perceived direction the current Successor of Peter wishes to take the Church. Such a view is sadly shortsighted and misunderstands the nature of the papacy entirely. Indeed, it can even fuel polarization and reduce the papacy to our political interests. As we are sure to hear a flurry of reports regarding the Vatican's current Synod on Synodality in the upcoming weeks, it is worth considering the obedience that St. John Paul II cited in his election applies to Pope Francis, also, and even more so applies to each of us. The teachings and deposit of faith we have received on the matters being discussed in the Synod on Synodality cannot be contradicted no matter what reports we may hear from the media. As members of the Church, let us all follow St. John Paul II's beautiful example of obedience and embrace the totality of the Catholic faith.

CATHOLIC Q & A: DROPPED HOST

?

holy men and women

Question: What happens to a consecrated host if it accidentally falls to the ground?

Answer: This a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that may be accidentally spilled.

Another question we might ask is: How should the ministers respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled? If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificator (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC: RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

The Tax of Caesar — Too often, I confuse this world with the next. Every day has its set of problems that need dealing with. Some are very easily discernible as problems of this world: I am tired, and I need a nap and a latte. Some are very obviously problems of eternity: I need to ask for forgiveness, but I'm not ready to admit it. Most problems are a subtle, maddening mix of the two: my body feels tired, obscuring how tired my soul also feels, while making me very cranky, which is keeping me from asking for the forgiveness I need.

It's not that the nap and the latte aren't solutions. Heaven forfend! I would never propose such a thing. Sleep and coffee, I am confident, can fix almost any problem in this world. This world. Too often, I slap a one-size-fits-all earthly band-aid on all my problems and rush on to the next thing. But if the problem is an issue of my soul, I may as well pay for a parking ticket in Monopoly money.

I render unto Caesar, and I forget about what is owed to God. I apply solutions meant for the here and now to problems that have eternal consequences. The spiritual problems are dismissed, shoved to the back of my mind. For when I have time, I tell myself. For when I am ready. But the only time we have is now. God is no king of this earth, and he does not ask for a tax offering. He asks for our heart. He doesn't want us for minions but for children.




