

# FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



While it is not particularly major news in comparison to the many other events taking place in the world, I cannot help but think that the recent decision of the U.S. Senate to jettison its informal dress code is a cultural marker worthy of reflection. For several decades, many societies around the world have been moving public dress—both in formal and informal settings—towards greater and greater casualness, sometimes even outright crudeness. The decision to allow senators—though, interestingly enough, not their assistants or any witnesses testifying before the senate—to wear whatever they deem fit while working in the chamber is the latest casualty in this onslaught of discarding norms for the sake of one's own individual preferences.

By no means am I a prude when it comes to dress codes, but they do serve important purposes and if we change them, it should only be done after careful consideration of both why the dress code exists in its current form and what consequences may flow from making the change. Take for instance the trend within the Catholic Church where it was fashionable for a season for priests to drop wearing clerics as a way of trying to stress solidarity with the laity and with the idea that this would make the priest more approachable. The problem was that this change, which thankfully is mostly abandoned now, missed the point that the clerics themselves were always meant to help people easily identify the priest. More than a few times I have been in public wearing my clerics to have people approach me with deep questions, a request for prayers, or just to express gratitude. None of these instances would have happened were I to have forgone wearing clerics as a general rule.

"Clothes make the man," Mark Twain is said to have remarked, "Naked people have little or no influence on society." As our culture's increased pursuit of leisurely attire and casualness even in formal matters marches forward, I wonder if it will be accompanied by a decrease in our ability to achieve greatness and advance serious work. Call me old-fashioned, but I would love to see a return to suits in offices, plumbers and electricians wearing collared shirts, slacks as normal in public settings, and the abolishment of "casual Friday." Perhaps not only others, but we ourselves would take our work more seriously and see in it greater glory.



# CATHOLIC Q & A: ST. JEROME

Question: Who is St. Jerome and why is he so significant that we honor him with a feast on Sept. 30?

Answer: St. Jerome (345–420) was considered the greatest biblical scholar of his day, conversant with Latin, Greek, and Hebrew. He set about translating the books of the Bible from their original languages into Latin.

Much of Jerome's correspondence has survived and gives us a powerful glimpse into the kind of person that he was, as well as the time in which he lived. Jerome eventually became Pope Damasus' (366–384) personal secretary. In the West, Latin was overtaking Greek as the language of the common people. The pope desired a translation of the Bible that would be accurately translated from the original languages into the language and idiom of the people. Previous Latin translations existed, but they were poor in quality.

Jerome set about this task and spent the rest of his life meticulously translating. He is credited with the translation of the Bible known as the Vulgate, a Latin translation intended to address the needs of the common people. That translation became the standard and the only one used by Catholics until modern times. Catholics did not actively engage in a similar process until 1943, when Pius XII allowed Catholic scholars once again to go back to the original languages and translate an accurate and meticulous version of the Bible. We carry on that tradition to this very day.






