FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



If everything goes according to plan, we should be back in the church for Mass beginning next Saturday, August 19th as construction on our parking lot project comes to a completion. If anything should change on that date, we will be sure to communicate it to the parish via our website and electronic communications. While it is wonderful to have Trinity Hall available for us to worship God during this construction, there is nothing quite like having Mass in a beautiful church. As we return to the church in the near future, I would like to take a moment here to point out a few items that will be different when we resume using the church publicly again.

The Parish Hall lighting has been entirely updated to have more energy efficient LED lighting, so people will likely notice a slightly different glow from the lighting when using Parish Hall. I've noticed that the Parish Hall is much more illuminated now and that the light is softer and warmer in its tone, which hopefully will make using Parish Hall a more pleasant experience for everyone. Additionally, as people use the church's basement, we have renamed the two rooms that are downstairs to give them a spiritual view. The wonderfully remodeled multi-purpose room (formerly called the "Nursery") will henceforth be known as the St. Sophia Room. The Y Disciple group that arranged for the refurbishing of the room was given the naming rights and I encourage everyone to look up the story of St. Sophia of Rome to learn more about her. Alongside the new name for our multi-purpose room, the money-counting and Knights of Columbus storage room will no longer be known as the "Knights Room" and will now be called the Bl. Michael McGivney Room in honor of the founder of the Knights of Columbus, who is also one of our great American Catholic heroes.

While these changes are subtle and easy to miss, I hope each of us can appreciate them and will get use to the new names for these rooms in the church. I encourage everyone to start referring to the St. Sophia Room and Bl. Michael McGivney Room by name when talking with one another or reserving a meeting in them, so that we can more quickly adopt this change as a parish. In the meantime, let us all pray for a successful and timely completion to the parking lot project so we can return to our beautiful church the weekend of August 19th-20th.

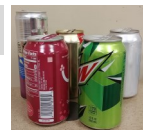

CATHOLIC Q & A: THE ASSUMPTION



Question: What lessons should I learn from the Assumption of Mary?

Answer: Growing in holiness is similar to training in a sport. We need someone to show us how we can live our faith well. Mary is a model of sanctity. She shows us how to be faithful to God's will, living each day with confidence in God's mercy and love. At the Nativity, in Jesus' public ministry, and at the Crucifixion, we see her steadfast trust. She allows the Lord to use her life to accomplish his plan for her and for all of us. In the Preface of the Mass for the Assumption of Mary, we pray: "For today the Virgin Mother of God was assumed into heaven as the beginning and image of your Church's coming to perfection and a sign of sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people."

It is this image of holiness that we strive to imitate. In the office, at home, or in our community, we look for signs of God's grace that call us to an ever greater love of him and each other. A greater awareness of God is a sign of our conversion of heart that lives the lessons Mary teaches.

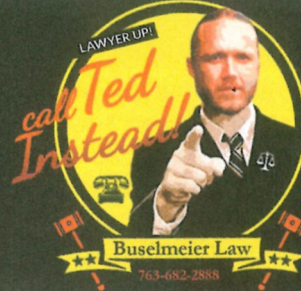
