

FROM FATHER'S DESK



Father Nathaniel Meyers

In his Easter homily in 1965, Pope St. Paul VI referred to Easter Sunday as, "this fundamental Sunday." The reasoning for calling Easter as the fundamental Sunday is outlined in His Holiness' homily as resulting from the fact that it was on that morning of the third day following Christ's Crucifixion that the conditions of our faith were born. St. Paul VI rightly speaks in his Easter homily about how the Resurrection brings more than just joy to those who hear its message, but it in fact brings a new state of mind and a sense of certainty to those who believe Jesus of Nazareth did not remain in death, but rose triumphantly to life.

The Resurrection is a foundational truth for us as Catholics. In a world full of uncertainty and in which each of us has experienced the unpredictability of life both in our own lived experience as well as in our observance of the news of the world, Easter reminds us that God is indeed the sovereign of the universe. Something so seemingly powerful and permanent as death is conquered by Jesus Christ through His Resurrection, showing that God is the ultimate power in this world. As such, we can therefore entrust our whole being to God and approach life with a sense of certainty thanks to the wondrous manifestation of God in His Son.

Easter Sunday is not just a holiday, or even just a Holy Day. Yes, it marks a new liturgical season in the Church, it rightly draws us together with loved ones to share a day of rejoicing, and it causes much of the modern world to stand still for a time. Yet, more than all of this, Easter Sunday is—as St. Paul VI rightly notes—a fundamental day. Our life should be rooted in the meaning and purpose of this day. Easter calls us to a new way of living, realizing that there is more to life than the things of this world. Eternity has been opened to each of us, so now we must choose to live our own lives with an eternal purpose in mind. May Easter Sunday 2023 be a new touchstone in each of our lives, so that each day that passes between this Easter and the next is lived in the light of the Resurrection.

Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments By: Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman

When you play peekaboo with a very young baby who has not yet developed object permanence, you actually feel kind of mean. As soon as your hands obscure your face, their little eyes widen with alarm and their expression crumbles into confusion and despair.

Because they can no longer see you, they believe you no longer exist. Their little brains are unable to understand that just because a thing cannot be seen, it is still there, still alive, still full of love and care and protection.

Aw, man, you can hear them thinking. I guess I don't have a mom anymore.

On Easter morning, Mary Magdalene sees the burial cloth but no body. Her human mind makes sense of the situation the best way it knows how, she assumes the Lord has been taken. I'm sure I would have thought the same thing, in her position.

She cannot conceive, on her own, the reality that Christ has risen from the dead. It doesn't matter that He has told His disciples again and again that this will happen. They weren't ready to understand then.

In many ways, Easter is when the human race really achieved object permanence. But we still struggle with it, don't we? I certainly do. So often I can be heard accusing God: "You weren't there. Where were you? I couldn't find you."

But I looked for Him in the flesh. I looked for Him in the stale yeast of the world — in money or success or affirmation or (worst of all) convenience and pleasure. Of course, I would not find him there, among the dead.




