FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



Today marks the Octave Day of Easter. Outside of the Church and music, I imagine the word "octave" is rarely used these days. Perhaps some will know it comes from the Latin word *octavus*, meaning eighth. As Easter Sunday was a week ago, that means this Sunday is now the eighth day of Easter. From a liturgical point-of-view, an Octave is the highest celebration in the Church's calendar. The Easter Octave is understood by the Church to be liturgically just one long day—hence why we say Easter Sunday, Easter Monday, Easter Tuesday, and so on. Yet, why did the Church choose to set the number of days at eight?

It would seem logical to assume the number of days we would mark for a major feast would be seven, since that is the number of perfection and corresponds to many Scriptural passages. In fact, the Church's focus on the number eight actually stems from the first chapter of Genesis, which notably depicts the creation of the world as taking place in seven days. Recalling the creation of the world, the Church sees the Resurrection of Jesus Christ as the start of a new creation. The world is made anew in the glory of Christ's triumph over sin and death, so we celebrate not only for seven days on our highest feasts such as Christmas and Easter, but also for an additional eighth day to mark the new work begun by the Resurrection.

The concept of the Octave is actually why the Church observes Sunday as a day of rest instead of Saturday. Saturday is technically the Sabbath because it is the seventh day on which God rested (the word Sabbath comes from the Hebrew *shabbath* meaning "to rest"). Yet, when Christ chose to rise, we hear over and over again in the New Testament that He did not rise on the last day of the week, but the first day of the week. As an act of Divine Providence, Christ rises from the grave as the week begins in order to demonstrate that He is starting a new creation, which is why Easter is sometimes called "the Eighth Day." During the Easter Season, let us take time to treasure each Sunday as not simply a day of rest, but also a day of new creation thanks to the glory of the Resurrection.



CATHOLIC Q & A — DIVINE MERCY



Question: Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from?

Answer: If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.

Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young women, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, "a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come."




