

FROM FATHER'S DESK

At long last, school is out for summer! I have definitely noticed a lot of the students in our building getting anxious over the past few weeks as the weather continued to become more and more summer-like. Naturally, the summer will have a wide variety of changes to people's schedules as families take vacations, people venture to cabins, and camping trips become a staple of people's activities. Our parish will obviously have a major change this summer as we relocate to Trinity Hall at our school for parish liturgies during the parking lot construction project. Yet, in all these things, the Mass is the constant that never changes.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, sometimes called the Feast of Corpus Christi. The Eucharist is at the heart of the Catholic life and while particulars about the Mass can change—whether because we are visiting a different parish or a parish needs to readjust a location due to a construction project—this most blessed sacrament stays constant. It's easy with sports tournaments, vacations, or road work to decide to skip Mass on a weekend. Indeed, we are all aware of family and friends who no longer attend Mass at all in addition to those who may miss due to prioritizing something above the Mass. As Catholics, it behooves each of us to hold ourselves to the highest standard possible and never miss Mass ourselves. By committing ourselves to fulfilling the Sunday obligation to attend Mass, we become witnesses to the truth of the Eucharist—namely, that God is among us.

As summer vacation begins for school students and the calendar shifts in various ways, my prayer is that each of us will remain steadfast in attending Mass during these upcoming months. Whether travelling or relocating to Trinity Hall, the Eucharist is not only worth our efforts to attend Mass, but quite frankly deserving of these efforts. What could be better than actually communing with the Lord Jesus Christ in His Body and Blood? Let us all answer that question with "nothing" and give witness by devoutly attending Mass each Sunday and Holy Day.

Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments By: Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman

The Priesthood & The Eucharist — "These two Sacraments were born together," wrote St. John Paul II of the priesthood and the Eucharist, "and their destiny is indissolubly linked until the end of the world."

The Eucharist is such a beautiful example of how God, conscious of our limitations, bends to meet us. He once came to us cloaked in the flesh, that we might recognize Him. Now He comes as the very means by which we nourish ourselves: food and drink, the most familiar and comforting thing in the world to us. How easy He makes it to fulfill his command that we become one with Him. How generous He is to make such a sacred thing also accessible.

We can say the same of the priesthood, and of the men He calls to its number. How generous of Him to make such an accessible thing — our sons, our brothers, our uncles, our cousins — sacred. How generous of Him to allow these human creations — who share in our own faults — to be the means through which He comes to us in the Eucharist.

Without the Eucharist, we would have no eternal life. Without priests, we would have no Eucharist. On this, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let's give thanks for our priests, and redouble our prayers that God will send us good and holy ones — manna from Heaven in our wandering exile.






