The Saint Who Prays With Us in the Mass (Part 1) (excerpts from Archbishop Cicognani) The Sacrifice of the Praise

In the Canon of the Mass, also known as Eucharistic Prayer I, the Holy Sacrifice is called "*this Sacrifice of Praise*." Truly it is magnificent praise: the "Eucharistic Sacrifice" by which we render thanks to the Father together with Jesus. It is a commemorative Sacrifice, since the Lord gave this order in the Cenacle: "*Do this in remembrance of Me*" (Luke 22:19); and the priest, immediately after the Consecration, recalls this command, adding the words: "*Mindful, therefore O Lord...*" It is a propitiatory or reparative action "*unto the forgiveness of sins*" (Matt. 26:28); an action of supplication, "*since He [Christ] lives always to make intercession for them*" (Heb 7:25). Supreme, therefore, is this glorification of God, a sublime homage and worthy adoration, inasmuch as heaven and earth take part in it, and Jesus, with the celebrating priest, is the protagonist, the invisible priest, "*mirabiliter et ineffabiliter constitutes*." (wonderfully and ineffably constituted).

The Mass is the Sacrifice of Jesus Christ, victim and priest; it is the sacrifice of the celebrating priest, minister of the Lord and eucharistic victim Himself; it is the sacrifice of the Church, which brings together all her children, militant, suffering, and triumphant, in adoration and remembrance. Saint Paul gives the following warning: "*As often as you shall eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until He comes*" (1 Cor. 11:26). The ancient ceremony of mixing a few drops of water with the wine at the Offertory, besides signifying the union in Christ of two natures, divine and human, also symbolizes this union of Christ with all the faithful, that is, with the Church, the true Mystical Body of Christ – of which He is the head and we the members.

The Altar

Through the ministry of the priest who celebrates, the entire Church becomes present and gathers around the altar. "*Altare quidem sanctae Ecclesiae, ipse est Christus*" (Roman Pontifical) (Indeed, the altar of the holy Church is Christ himself); the altar represents Christ and His work for the salvation of souls. The altar recalls that table on which our Lord transformed bread and wine into His Body and Blood and at which He ordered His Apostles to continue to celebrate the Divine Sacrifice. The altar, as a small elevation, recalls to mind the hill of Calvary where Christ completed His sacrifice and died on the cross. The altar – derived from "*alta ara*" meaning high place – and therefore always placed at a focal point in the church, represents that spiritual elevation or perfection to which Christ invites all: "*You therefore are to be perfect, even as your heavenly Father is perfect*" (Matt. 5:48). For all these reasons the celebrant in the Mass, before turning to the people and saying "*Dominus vobiscum – The Lord be with you*" – kisses the altar, as if to take from Christ, peace, love, grace, and happiness, and in turn, give all these to the people.

"*Draw near to Him, a living stone, rejected indeed by men but chosen and honored by God*" (1 Pet. 2:4). Holy, therefore, glorious sublime is the altar where the priest celebrates, even if it be poor and unadorned.

(PRACTICING CATHOLIC)

Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments

Take More — It doesn't matter what time of day we visit my mother-in-law — she always has food to offer. If we take two helpings, she will encourage us to take three. If we take three helpings, she will say, "*Coraggio* — take more." (She's Italian, in case you couldn't tell from the food-pushing and the language.)

When Jesus feeds the five thousand with the miracle of the loaves and fish, he does not produce *just* enough food to feed everyone who is there. He certainly could — that would be within his power. And he shows concern about waste, so it would make sense for him to do that. But instead, he deliberately overproduces. He creates more food than is necessary. He makes an abundance of it. Why?

I think it's for the same reason my mother-in-law keeps urging us to eat when we come to her house. Feeding people is not just a functional action. It's a gesture. It shows love. It shows concern. It shows welcome. Having an abundance of food — so much that there is some left over — is a sign that you don't care how much someone wants — you are ready to give whatever they are ready to take. You are ready to give recklessly. You are ready to give them not just all they need but also all they could want.

I think of this when I approach the Sacrament of Confession. Time and time again I walk up to the door of that little room, a list of oft-repeated sins in my hand and a sense of shame on my heart.

Here I am again, Jesus. Back for more mercy. Hope you haven't run out.

He hasn't yet. He never will. "*Coraggio*," he whispers deep in my heart, "take more."

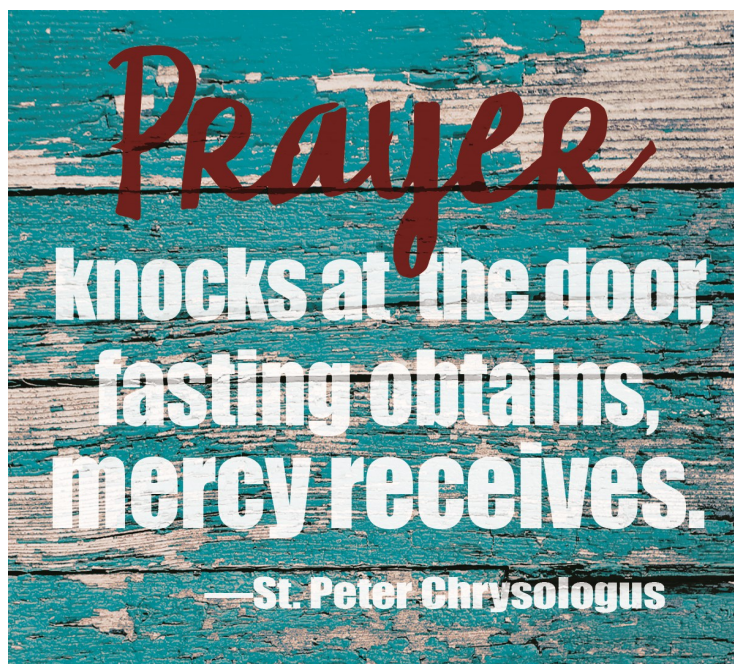

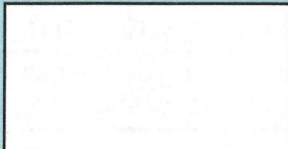
