FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Mevers



We have finally come to the last week of summer vacation. In just a mere nine days from this Sunday, students will once again be making their way into schools to begin a new year of learning. Our Catholic school has seen another strong increase in enrollment and is nearly full in each grade—we even have wait lists in some grades the demand for our school is so high. However, before those students arrive for the first day of school, there is still plenty of work to be done to make sure everyone is in great shape for the new year.

Teachers, principals, kitchen staff, office administration, and custodial staff all are working hard to make sure the new academic year is a fruitful one for students and their families. As Catholics, we have the great advantage of invoking the intercession of the saints in readying ourselves for the new school year. Such heroic figures as St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, St. John Baptist de la Salle, St. Angela Merici, and countless other teachers and founders are a resource that all Catholics—whether working in parochial schools or public institutions—can invoke for protection, wisdom, and inspiration. I've made it a habit or regularly asking the intercession of saints as I prepare a presentation, homily, or other kind of lesson in order to root the enterprise in more than just my own efforts. As a parish that supports a Catholic school, it behooves each of us to call upon the saints for a successful school year.

As a concrete way of supporting our Catholic school and making sure it has a wonderful beginning on September 6th, I would ask each of us to invoke St. Aloysius Gonzaga (patron saint of young students), St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (patron saint of Catholic schools), St. John Baptist de la Salle (patron saint of teachers), and St. Francis Xavier (our parish's patron) daily over the next week so that each person is ready for a great and successful start to the new school year.



CATHOLIC Q & A: SIGN BEFORE THE GOSPEL

Question: I've been wondering: Why do we make the 3 signs of the cross before the Gospel?



Answer: Certainly, many people go to Mass or other devotions, doing and saying things out of habit or reverence and not really understanding the reasons behind some of these things. But everything we do has a meaning or purpose that helps us to worship better, proclaim our beliefs, or focus the attention of the people on something that has a greater importance or significance. A review of the meaning of various gestures and practices can help us have a deeper appreciation for what we do.

There is a little prayer that goes with the three crosses before the Gospel: "May the words of the Holy Gospel be on my mind, on my lips and in my heart." In standing to hear the Gospel, we acknowledge that Jesus is present, and the words of the Gospel are addressed to us. All of the gestures and special postures we adopt before the Gospel are intended to help us prepare for hearing the Word as well as act on it. The incense, the Alleluia, the deacon or priest, and the special dialogue and announcement that introduces the Gospel help us focus our attention on the Good News we are about to hear. The three signs of the cross show our desire and good intention to hear and live the Gospel.

NEW! Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS): A Montessori based faith program for 3-6 year olds (Must be potty trained). Parents meet once/month and children come once/week. Orientation on September 14th.

Family of Faith (Grades 1st-5th): Parents and children meet twice/month at the Education Center and families have lessons at home the rest of the month.

Middle School Faith Formation (Grades 6th-8th): Students meet weekly at Education Center.


