FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



The news of the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith's declaration *Fiducia supplicans* has created a number of news stories and questions among Catholics and non-Catholics alike. Indeed, my phone was blowing up with questions and comments from other priests, friends, parishioners, and family within hours of the media reporting on this document. One thing I have noticed is that a great many people—including priests—formed their opinions on this news without actually reading the document in question first. I took time to read *Fiducia supplicans* as well as some theological analysis about it. While the world is interested in focusing on the hot button issues connected with this document—that is to say, its purported openness to blessing same-sex couples or couples in invalid marriages—I actually have been more curious about its implicit ideas on papal authority (something that I have seen only one article address).

In order to help bring a more theologically vigorous understanding of *Fiducia supplicans* and both what it does and does not say, I have decided to offer a “town hall” of sorts. The point of this gathering will not be for people to come and share their own opinions, but rather to help encourage those who attend to learn how to read Church documents carefully and completely by offering a detailed analysis of *Fiducia supplicans* and explaining the exact weight of this document in relation to other Magisterial documents. I will be happy to field questions as part of the event, but the majority of the time would be a presentation on the document and how we are to understand it in light of the Church's clear teachings on sexual morality as well as the practice of offering blessings. I also will take some time to tease out the questions about papal authority that also are tied into this document.

In order to accommodate various schedules, I will be offering this presentation twice. The first option for people to attend will be Thursday, January 18th in Parish Hall following the 8:00am morning Mass. The second option will be on Sunday, January 21st again in Parish Hall at 1:00pm. For those who are either excited or concerned about what they have heard about this document, I encourage you to attend one of these sessions and invite others who you think will find a careful, considered evaluation of the declaration valuable for their own growth in the Catholic faith.

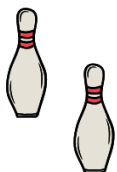

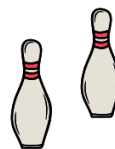

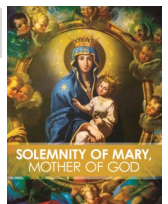

CATHOLIC Q & A: SERVANT SONGS



Question: What are the servant songs of Isaiah? How do they relate to Jesus' life and ministry?

Answer: The four servant songs (Isaiah 42:1-4, 49:1-6, 50:4-9, and 52:13—53:12) are strategically placed in Second Isaiah to offer hope and consolation to a suffering Israel during its Babylonian Exile. Israel had been defeated by the Babylonians, who destroyed their temple, killed the last of the kings in David's lineage, exiled them from their land, and transported them to Babylon. This is the context in which Second Isaiah composes his powerfully poetic book of hope and consolation. A significant part of that message is the portrait of God's servant, who is called to be a source of hope and encouragement for the people.

Each of the four poems emphasizes God's choice and election of the servant. The last poem stresses the suffering and rejection of God's servant, along with his eventual death. Isaiah is certain that God will use the servant's innocent suffering as a way to redeem and remove the guilt and sin of others. Thus, the servant becomes a source of salvation for himself and for others. Who is this servant? Many suggest that Isaiah was referring to Israel herself, as she underwent suffering which would ultimately prove to be redemptive. Jesus' followers, including those for whom Mark wrote his Gospel, understood Jesus' ministry in terms of Isaiah's suffering servant whose innocent suffering and death became the means of salvation for all.

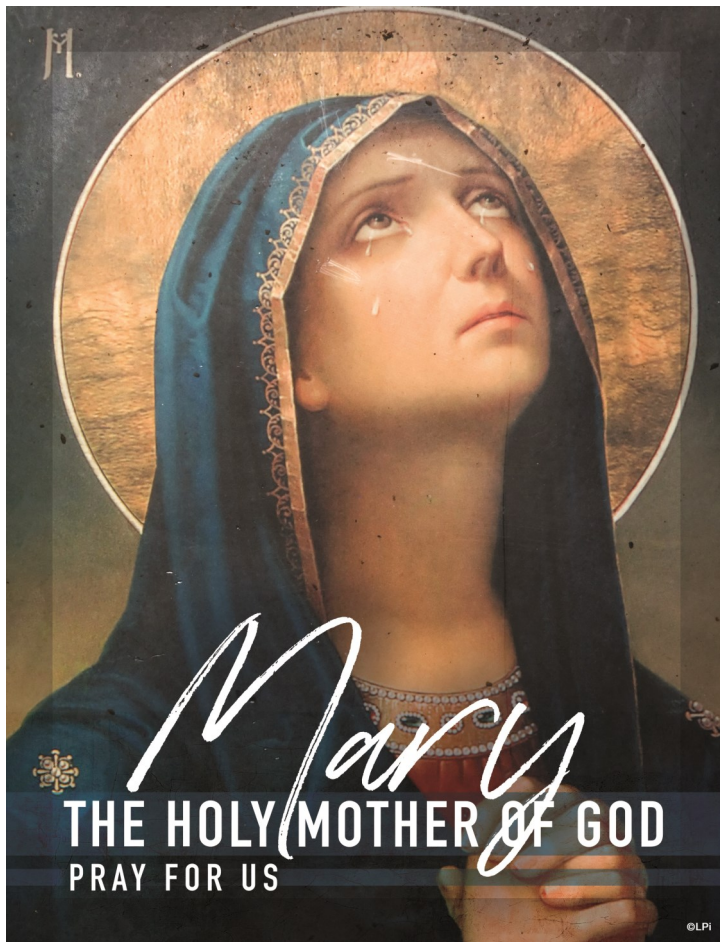


NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC PILGRIMAGE

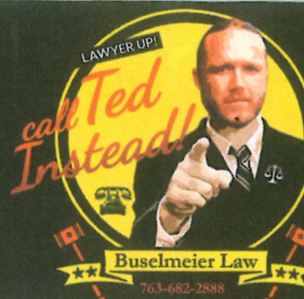
