FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



We are once again taking up our Do Unto Others collection this weekend, which has been a part of our parish for five years now. Our first Do Unto Others collection occurred in September 2017 and, since that time, we have supported a wide variety of organizations locally, statewide, and nationally. The money that so many of our parishioners have generously contributed to these organizations has made a true difference in their ability to provide needs to the homeless, sick, hungry, and others on the margins of society (such as those with Down's Syndrome, for example). I consider the Do Unto Others collection to be among the most wonderful things that our parish does to preach and live the Gospel.

In just the past few months, we have been able to use the percentage of our Do Unto Others collection that goes to emergency needs to help people as they deal with unexpected developments in their life as well as those being hurt most acutely by the economic challenges of our world. We have been able to contribute to housing people who have been in dangerous situations as well as to support a family deep in mourning at a sudden tragedy that created a major financial burden for them. The donations to Do Unto Others make a real difference in the lives of people, so I want to express my heartfelt appreciation to everyone for making it such a wonderful work of mercy in our parish.

It is interesting that our currency regularly has the phrase "In God We Trust" on it. Perhaps someday this will be dropped from our money, but I hope we keep it on our money as it offers a great perspective on how to look at material wealth. The money we have is ultimately a way in which we are called to participate in God's work—whether by providing for our family or donating to a charity or purchasing products to promote the common good. As such, we should discern wisely how to use our money and ultimately realize that the best use of it is one that is marked by a deep trust in God. By giving to those who in no way will ever pay us back, we are announcing a great trust in the good God will do through that charitable gift.

CATHOLIC Q & A

Question: My friend is just beginning to explore the Catholic faith but was raised agnostic. How do I help them start to develop a relationship with God?

Answer: Start on a personal level! How did you and your friend become friends? How did the personal topic of faith come up? Communication, spending time together, and getting to know each other are essential to forming the bonds of a relationship. Personal prayer is essential to our relationship with God. We can't be close to someone we don't know! Invite your friend to explore the stories of Jesus in the Bible. Introduce them to the lives of the saints, especially ones you think they might be interested in.

Your friend might also have questions about the Catholic faith that you don't know how to answer. If your friend hasn't yet enrolled in RCIA classes, invite them to Mass at your parish. Personal support can be helpful as well as connecting your friend to other people in your parish living their faith well. The good examples of other faithful people could help your friend to feel welcomed and supported.
