

FROM FATHER'S DESK



Father Nathaniel Meyers

It's hard to believe we are already entering into the last week of June. Every year I think summer is going to last longer than it actually does. Already I've been looking at curriculum for our Catholic school's Middle School theology classes and finding some interesting possibilities for the future, which also are prompting some nascent thoughts on ideas for adult faith formation opportunities we can host here in our parish. Yet, before we get to any of those activities, we have a major project that is upon us: the expansion of our parking lot at the church.

As has been mentioned previously, we are slated to begin construction on the parking lot on Monday, July 10th with a target completion date of Friday, August 18th. Obviously, this will mean the construction crew will be working hard and need good weather to keep everything on schedule, so I once again invite everyone to join me in praying for good weather that will allow for the parking lot project to be completed on time and well. Since access to the church building will be obstructed by the parking lot construction, we are going to be relocating activities and liturgies to the school during this time period.

Beginning Tuesday, July 11th, all of our confessions and Masses will be held at the school. I am planning to post signs that will help direct people to the music practice room that will be converted into a confessional for those weeks, while the Masses will all take place in Trinity Hall. Similarly, committees and other groups that use the church will either suspend their meetings during those weeks or use space in the school. The church doors will be locked to the general public during the construction project so as to make sure people aren't walking around the construction site and to help deter any interruptions to the work as well as to avoid possible accidents or injuries. While it will be sad not to use our beautiful church during those weeks, the return to the church in August will be a truly joyous one as our parking lot is expanded and our water drainage system is improved to ensure the church's foundation stays strong. If anybody has any questions about the logistics of moving over to the school this summer, please do not hesitate to reach out to me or our parish office staff.

CATHOLIC Q & A: LECTIO DIVINA

Question: What is Lectio Divina, and how is it associated with the Benedictine Monastic tradition, whose founder, St. Benedict, we honor on July 11th?

Answer: Benedict desired his monks to live in community, praying the Liturgy of the Hours together, contemplating sacred texts, and doing manual labor. The monks developed a technique to facilitate a spiritual and devotional reading of the Bible known as Lectio Divina, the holy reading of a text. This method encourages the reader to hear the biblical text with an open heart and focus on whatever God wants to highlight and then apply it to daily life.

There are variations on Lectio Divina, but essentially, the technique consists of a three-step process of reflection. When the reflection is done with a group, the responses are shared by all the participants. Once the text is selected, it is read meditatively, and the following are then explored: a word or phrase that attracts you; how and where the content of this reading touches your life today; what you believe that God wants you to do during this coming week (month, year, lifetime).

Thanks to Benedict, the Christian community has been gifted with this special way of entering into the biblical text. This week, use the Lectio Divina process on one of the readings for the coming Sunday and make a note of the life connections you are making. How is this reflection drawing you closer to God and others?


