

## FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



While it took a while for us to get some cold weather, we have finally managed to start experiencing some temperatures that match up with the usual Minnesota expectations for winter. Many parishioners have mentioned how they are enjoying the mild temperatures and it certainly is the case that frequent bathroom trips outside with a new puppy have been much more comfortable than would be the case in a typical year, but there's also been a downside in those trips: muddy paws. For years, as a dog owner, I have always appreciated the fact that winter freezes the ground and provides a prolonged reprieve from having to wipe paws every time the dogs return from being outside. Yet, this year has given no such reprieve and the frequent trips have meant I've spent plenty of time ensuring 12 paws are thoroughly clean before letting the dogs back into the rectory.

Reflecting upon this dynamic—more comfortable temperatures mixed with a muddier ground—has reminded me of a great truth about life: nothing is all upside in this world. Everything we do has some cost to it and inhibits our ability to do something else. By no means is this necessarily a bad thing, but it does remind us that we will never achieve perfect harmony or wholeness on earth. Far too often, however, we are being told that we can "have it all" and that there are no limits for us. Many marketers spend hours finding sophisticated ways to ensure that customers never think of the cost when purchasing a product, while politicians often present policy proposals with the promise that the benefits will be endless without requiring any unpleasant compromise. Such propositions are false, of course, and everything in this world comes at a price. Yet, it is precisely in evaluating things in this manner that we begin to understand what we value and how we want to live our lives.

We are now a week into 2024, which is a perfect time for each person to evaluate how we wish to move forward with our choices. Realizing that this year will not present us with a perfect scenario that involves no tradeoffs, we can begin these next twelve months taking time to think about how our decisions can help us to lead a more virtuous and holy life. Sometimes, the costs yield a great benefit while at others, they help us to move away from something that isn't really in our ultimate interest. As we start a new year, let us each proceed forward with a realistic view of the things that are before us so that we can make the decisions that yield the greatest good for our souls.

#### CATHOLIC Q & A

Question: How are the feasts of the baptism of Jesus and the account of the wedding feast of Cana related to the Epiphany celebration?

Answer: Epiphany focuses on revealing Jesus to the world. Following the Christmas celebration, the liturgical year lays out manifestation points in which Jesus is made publicly known. From the beginning, the Christian community highlighted three events: The Epiphany, the Baptism of Jesus and the wedding feast at Cana.

The Epiphany discloses Jesus to the world of the Gentiles, represented by the magi from the East. Jesus' baptism reveals his identity and mission. The miracle of turning water to wine at the wedding feast of Cana, unique to John's Gospel, is the first public sign that Jesus performs, thus manifesting his public identity and his powers.

Today in the Roman Church, these are usually celebrated on three successive Sundays: Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord which is usually the next Sunday, and the wedding feast of Cana, which is proclaimed on the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time in lectionary year C.

These feasts connect around the concept of epiphany, public manifestation of Jesus to the world. They help us know Jesus more intimately. Spend some time delving more deeply into your understanding of who Jesus is. Cultivate these "epiphany" moments in your life.




