FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



By now I am sure most of us have heard the news that the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis will be getting a new auxiliary bishop, Michael Izen. Bishop-elect Izen is currently serving as the pastor of Churches of St. Michael and St. Mary in Stillwater, but many of us here may know him as our former neighbor at St. Timothy's in Maple Lake. I first met Bishop-elect Izen when I was a newly ordained priest assigned to St. Michael; my experiences of him then were that he was a man of great hospitality, generosity, and pastoral zeal. When the news was announced earlier this month of Bishop-elect Izen being named our next auxiliary, I was thrilled and saddened. Thrilled as I think he will be a wonderful bishop; saddened in that the Archdiocese will be losing one of its best pastors.

Of course, this is the nature of the beast. Whenever a priest becomes a bishop, the pool of talented men serving in parishes becomes smaller. Accordingly, as Catholic faithful, we should do our utmost to make sure we consistently replenish our ranks. Much like the rest of society, the Church is going to be experiencing a population crunch very shortly. As Americans have had fewer and fewer children over the years, our population's demographics have shifted towards an older and smaller amount of people. We naturally aren't feeling this yet due to the migration of people into our country, but immigrants similarly adopt our societal norm of not having children. The result is that the forthcoming retirement of Baby Boomers over the next decade will lead many institutions, including the Church, with a dearth of workers.

Many people have written about a priest shortage and discussed how to address it, but so often the solutions proposed seem to skip one truly obvious option: to encourage parents and grandparents to actively promote priestly and religious vocations for their children. Even many of the most devout families I know do not present a priestly calling to their son as something to pursue and consider. Furthermore, I almost never meet the family that is promoting religious life to their daughters. As a result, we should not be surprised if we see less Catholic children and young adults seriously discerning such callings. As our Archdiocese will be losing a great priest now that Bishop-elect Izen is moving on to a new calling, I ask each of us to promote vocations in our own families and nurture open hearts to priestly and religious callings.

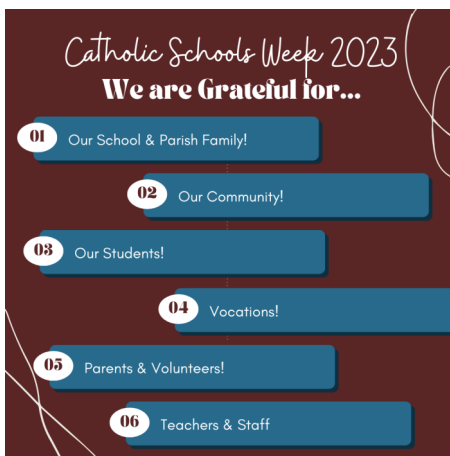
MESSAGE FROM ALISA LOUWAGIE, PRINCIPAL OF STFX SCHOOL

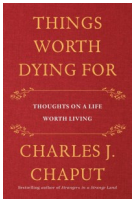

CATHOLIC Q & A: SAINT VS. BLESSED

Question: What is the difference between a "Saint" and a Blessed?"



Answer: The process of proclaiming someone as a saint in the Catholic Church has evolved over the course of many centuries. In the beginning, those honored as saints were almost exclusively biblical figures or martyrs. However, after the legalization of Christianity in the 4th century, new holy women and men came to be honored as saints, and this was often done by popular acclaim or by the local bishop or abbot. It was Pope Gregory IX (who was pope from 1227 to 1241) who officially proclaimed that only the pope had the authority to add someone to the official list (the "canon") of saints. This is the meaning of the word "canonization."

Today, the saint-making process includes several steps, including detailed studies of the person's life and a recognition that they died as a martyr or lived a life of "heroic virtue." Once recognized as a martyr or if a miracle is attributed to their intercession, they will be beatified and honored as "Blessed." This means that they can be celebrated by Catholics in a particular country or region or by the members of certain religious community. If another miracle occurs and is approved, then the "Blessed" is canonized and honored with the title "Saint," meaning that they are now officially recognized as a universal model of holiness and an intercessor. ©LPi

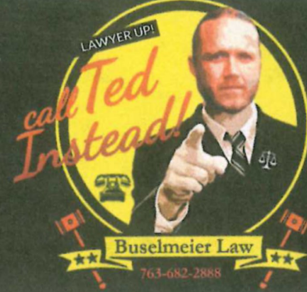
