## FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



On Divine Mercy Sunday, as some of you may remember, Sofia Nikula left our parish to join the Carmelite convent in Lake Elmo. As we offered her a special blessing at the Vigil Mass that weekend, I was fortunate enough to spend a few minutes visiting with Sofia after Mass that evening to wish her well. "With any luck," Sofia said, "you'll never see or hear from me again." We shared a nice laugh over her joke, but the comment has reverberated with me over the last month. Indeed, if none of us were to ever see or hear from Sofia again, it would be a stroke of great blessings for all of us, for it would mean that she is progressing in the contemplative life.

Our world does not value contemplation in a true sense anymore. People certainly fixate on various things—be it politics or sports or neighborhood gossip—and obsessive behavior is encouraged by social media and other forms of digital communication. The sinful and abhorrent shootings over the past week (particularly in Buffalo, NY) appear to be products of this unhealthy form of fixation on one's own grievances and conspiracies. Our minds cannot help but wonder and conjure ideas, but without a proper purpose to our soul, these ideas can turn quite destructive. The contemplative life is one that values silence, communion with God, and fixes its gaze on what is eternal. While Sofia and her sisters at Carmel are living this in a radical way, each of us should look to develop a contemplative life for our own soul.

Contemplation gets to the deeper meaning of things and seeks genuine understanding. In order to cultivate such a life, we obviously need both silence and good instruction. As Catholics, we are blessed to be the inheritors of two millennia worth of prayer and intellectual inquiry. Perhaps each of us can make a commitment in the upcoming summer months to read a book by a Catholic author that will help foster a spirit of contemplation. To this end, I am planning to use this column for the next few weeks to offer suggestions for summer reading to help foster a contemplative and peaceful spirit within each of us.

#### Responding to God

Question: I can't explain it. I feel a nudge from God to something out of the ordinary. How do I respond?

Answer: You're in good company! Abraham was asked to leave all he knew and loved for a strange land, with only abstract divine assurance that such a sacrifice would be worth it. Plenty of prophets protested against God's call, whether it was claiming they were too young (Jeremiah) or running away entirely, only to end up in a whale's belly (Jonah). St. Joseph was asked to do something very strange. He was asked to believe — on the word of an angelic appearance in a dream — that his betrothed was pregnant not from another man, but by a miraculous intervention of God. Then he was called to marry her.

Author Flannery O'Connor once wrote, "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you odd." Sometimes God's invitation might seem strange or challenging. It might require sacrifices we never expected to make. Our life might look different than we had always imagined. But as we all know, life throws its own curveballs, regardless of whether or not we're listening for God's will. Better, one would think, to be open to the promptings of God and to follow along the strange trails that they lead. We have the assurance that, eventually, we will find green pastures.


