

## FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



The Easter Season comes to an end this weekend with Pentecost, but the celebratory characteristic of these past 50 days does not need to end with it. In fact, the upcoming Sundays will mark two of the most important feasts in our liturgical year—the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity and the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. The Easter experience of the Risen Lord is one that never ends and Christian life should carry forth the new creation that has been inaugurated in the Resurrection and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. By our prayer, works of mercy, and embracing of the Gospel, each of us can share with the world the grace God has given to us and help people to experience the joy the Easter Season has marked these last two months.

In a couple of weeks, we will have a very concrete opportunity to share the joy of Easter with those in need. Archbishop Hebda has asked every parish in the Archdiocese to hold a second collection to help with needed upkeep and repairs of the Byrne Residence, which is the retirement home for priests of the Archdiocese. After looking at our calendar, I have decided to hold this collection the weekend of June 18<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup>, which will coincide with the celebration of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ as well as Father's Day.

The priests who live at the Byrne Residence have faithfully served as spiritual fathers for many decades and the facility will be used to house priests for many years to come. At this time, the facility is in need of upkeep to help priests continue to live in community together as they progress in years and require more nursing care. I hope all of you will join me in contributing to this second collection for the Byrne Residence, so that the current residents and future priests will have a safe place to live in retirement that provides not only for their physical needs, but also their human and spiritual ones.



## UPCOMING FEAST DAY

## St. Germaine Cousin Wednesday, June 15th

Saint Germaine was born in Pibrac, France in 1579 to poor parents. Her story is a heart wrenching one. She was born with a deformed right arm and hand, and her mother died when she was an infant. Her father remarried, but her stepmother brutally abused and neglected her.



As a child Germaine suffered from scrofula, a disfiguring form of tuberculosis which causes swelling and lesions on the side of the neck. Already sick, abused, and starving, she was forced to sleep in barn with sheep she tended.

Despite everything, Germaine lived each day tending her flock with joy and in prayer. Mary and Jesus became her friends. She shared what little she had and taught the children of the village about God's love. A rosary made of string knots was her constant companion. She attended Mass every day, leaving her sheep in care of guardian angels. Her flock was never attacked by wolves and never wandered. Some claimed to see the waters of the flooded river part so she could get to Mass.

She is often portrayed with an apron full of flowers because one winter day her stepmother accused her of stealing bread from the house and hiding it her apron. But when she was seized and forced to open the apron an abundance of spring flowers tumbled forth. It was this incident that compelled the villagers and even her parents to recognize her holiness.

Germaine died at 22. More than forty years later, her body was accidentally exhumed and found to be incorrupt. She was canonized by Pope Pius IX in 1867 and inscribed into the canon of virgins.

## CATHOLIC Q & A

## Mass Celebrated Around the World

Question: Is the Catholic Mass really celebrated the same throughout the whole world?

Answer: One of the truisms of the Catholic Faith is that "wherever you go in the world, the Mass is the same." In fact, the answer to this question is both "yes" and "no." On the one hand, the essential elements of the Roman Rite are the same. The structure of the Mass as it is presented in the Roman Missal is consistent and this is one of the beauties of belonging to a liturgical tradition.

On the other hand, there are elements of celebrations that can vary depending on the country or even local region you might be in. For example, in certain parts of the world, certain feasts and solemnities are celebrated on different days (i.e. in the United States the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord can be celebrated on Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter or on the Seventh Sunday of Easter, depending on area diocese). Whether it is the use of certain liturgical colors, local celebrations of regional saints, special seasonal blessings of crops or produce, or the use of dance and processions all demonstrate a sort of organic variety that can exist even within our established liturgical tradition. While we always respect what is essential to the rite, local variations and traditions are very much in keeping with the vision of liturgical renewal envisioned by the Second Vatican Council's Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (nos. 37-40).


