FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



I saw a headline recently that read, "Black Death origin mystery solved — 675 years later!" We all have heard various account of the Black Death, the most infamous bubonic plague in world history that stands as the most fatal pandemic in human history and one that markedly changed nearly every aspect of human life in Europe. As someone who has had a cursory interest in the Black Death for years, I couldn't help but read this article. According to evidence found in a burial ground in Kyrgyzstan, a mountainous landlocked country in Central Asia, a rise of deaths occurred from the Black Death beginning in 1338—roughly ten years before the previously confirmed first case in Crimea.

The implications of the Black Death's origins will not make much difference to any of us living in the 21st century, of course, and even a careful reading of the article reveals that the headline is an overstatement; none of the historians researching this subject claim to have solved the origin of the Black Death, but simply to have found evidence that leads to further questions. Although this historical investigation will not have any direct impact on us, the story nevertheless struck me as one worth our considering as we look at the COVID-19 pandemic as well as the many other investigations or debates which currently embroil our world. If after nearly an entire century of investigation we still do not have a firm answer on the origins of the Black Death, we should be quite hesitant to assume we will have definitive answers on the events and times in which we live.

There is a natural tendency in each of us to rush to a conclusion and assume we know all the relevant information. However, we should work against this inclination and always have a healthy amount of humility when evaluating any given issue, whether it is a worldwide pandemic, a political crisis, or even a dispute with a neighbor. None of us is omniscient and our knowledge will always be incomplete. The search for the truth is one that never ends, but thankfully we do have God's revelation in the Scriptures and the Tradition to guide us along the path of truth. As we look into the mysteries of life—both in the past and in the present—let us all make good use of the Catholic faith in coming to a deeper awareness of the truth.




