FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



According to the Farmers' Almanac, we are in the final stretch of the "dog days of summer." In fact, according to custom, this coming Thursday, August 11th marks the last of the dog days—although, as any Minnesotan knows, the weather never really follows our designations of seasons. The phrase "dog days of summer" actually dates back the antiquity as the Greeks and Romans noticed in the summer that the star Sirius, which forms part of the Canis Major constellation, would rise and appear alongside the Sun. Various individuals considered this astrological phenomenon to be part of the cause for the increased heat during this time of year and thus the dies caniculares (literally "puppy days") was born.

Of course, in the year 2022, we do not attribute the placement of Sirius in the night sky as contributing to the temperature here on Earth. While the brightest star in the night sky, Sirius is about 8.7 light-years away from our planet and we cannot measure any effect it has on us here at all. Nevertheless, while the ancient world's analysis is ultimately incorrect, I cannot help but admire the fact that those Greeks and Romans looked to the stars to understand life. The universe is a marvelous reality and demonstrates the wondrous power of God. Far too often we look down at the dirt to understand our life and while this also has a place, perhaps in the last couple of centuries we have started to look too much towards the ground and not enough towards the sky.

Looking up to the sky necessarily means looking outward and beyond, which in turn requires us to acknowledge that there is much we do not know and cannot comprehend. Indeed, searching the stars can be a humbling experience as one thinks of the vastness of space and the many mysteries it contains. As we look to make sense of ourselves and the world around us, let us each take time to contemplate that which is beyond us, for in doing so we will ultimately arrive at God.

CATHOLIC Q & A — ST. LAWRENCE

Question: On August 10th we celebrate the feast of St. Lawrence. Can you tell us a bit about him?

Answer: Little is known about Lawrence other than he was a deacon during the reign of Emperor Valerian from 253–259. In 258, Valerian began a persecution of the Roman Church. Lawrence was in charge of the purse for the Church of Rome. Roman officials demanded that the riches of the church be handed over to them. Lawrence asked for a few days to gather them.

Lawrence took the money he had charge over and distributed it to the poor of Rome. Then he gathered the homeless and poor together. When the officials came demanding the riches of the church, Lawrence pointed to the destitute and homeless, saying that these were the true riches of the church. For this he was imprisoned and tortured, and put to death by burning on a gridiron. It is said that as he was dying, he told his executioners to turn him over because he was done on one side and needed to be fully cooked for the Lord.

Lawrence continues to be a model for us today. The church needs continual reminders that its riches are the people. The primary purpose and mission of the church is to be continually sensitive to the needs of all God's people, most especially the least of our brothers and sisters. ©LPi


